

One example Father cited was from the life St. Therese.

When getting ready to make a formal entrance into her Community, Therese suddenly began to experience great doubts about her vocation. This seemed unusual because she had never experienced any doubt before. However, in a spirit of humility, she confided her sense of insecurity to her superiors. They then reassured her. Indeed, one even "laughed" at the prospect that she was not suited for the religious life, because it was so apparent that she was.

In the same way, the Lord wants us "not to hide", but to bring all our concerns and cares to Him.
